Background (1)

 Directive 2009/128/EC (SUD) - as implemented in Ireland by S.I. 155 of 2012:

...framework for community action to achieve sustainable use of pesticides

...to protect human health and the environment

...promote IPM





Background (2)

 Currently, SUD only includes Plant Protection Products (PPPs) in its scope

 Pesticides = PPPs + Biocides (disinfectants, preservatives, pest control products, antifoulants etc.)





Main Impacts of SUD

- Registration and Training
- Sprayer Testing
- · Controls on Storage, Supply and Use
- Integrated Pest Management
- Protection of water from Pesticides

Training

Pesticide Advisors (PA)

- Since November 2013, all PAs must be registered with the DAFM
- Dip in IPM and Sustainable Use of Pesticides or equivalent
- Must maintain CPE IASIS scheme or equivalent



PAs

- DAFM registered PAs are required to achieve either a minimum of 100 IASIS CPE credits (or equivalent) over the previous calendar year, or an average of 100 IASIS credits/annum over the previous two calendar years!
- Where a PA fails to meet this requirement, the following rules apply:



PAS

 Where a lapsed PA had previously NOT completed the IASIS Crop Protection course, the BASIS (UK) Cert.in Crop Protection, the UCD Dip in IPM and the Sustainable Use of Pesticides, (or equivalent), he/she must embark on such formal training before being readmitted to the DAFM register of PAs. [This applies to any such lapse, irrespective of the length of the lapsed period. Normal CPE rules will then apply].



PAS

 Where the lapsed PA holds one of the above qualifications, provisional readmission to the DAFM register will be granted for 1 year, conditional on he/she achieving 200 IASIS CPE credits during that year.

If the applⁿ for readmission is made before 15 April, the PA will remain on the register for the current year and must achieve 200 CPE credits before the end of that year. Otherwise, the appl^{nt} will not be readmitted until the following Jan., and must then achieve the 200 CPE credits in the year of his/her readmission.

Pesticide Distributor (PD)

- Must be registered by 26 Nov 2015
- Handling and Distribution of Pesticides course 552466, FETAC Level 5, 2 day duration.
- Must maintain CPE IASIS scheme or equivalent



Training the Professional User (PU)



- Protection of operators, bystanders and consumers
- Only use approved product

- Follow label recommendations
- Protection of water, buffer zones respected




Training the Professional User (PU)

Inspectors of Equipment

- DAFM/Teagasc 2 day course in Kildalton
- Must be registered with DAFM and maintain CPE
- Tests must be done by DAFMregistered Equipment Inspector, recorded online to DAFM system



Application Equipment

 All boom sprayers > 3m and all blast and orchard sprayers must be tested at least once by

26 November 2016

- Testing interval must not exceed 5 years up to 2020
- Testing interval must not exceed 3 years thereafter



Application Equipment

- Timetable and inspection intervals for other types of application equipment will also be developed in due course
- Knapsack sprayers exempt
- New sprayers must be tested at least once within 5 years of purchase



Storage

- Pesticide products must be stored in a secure, dry area which cannot result in accidental releases to drains, wells or water courses.
- Empty, triple-rinsed containers and foil caps must be disposed of in accordance with the Good Practice Guide

Record Keeping

 Records of use must be maintained (by landowner, contractor) in the PPP Use Record sheet

IPM

- Prevention/suppression of harmful organisms
- Monitoring of harmful organisms
- Application (or not) of plant protection measures
- Sustainable biological, physical or other nonchemical methods
- Use of target-specific pesticides
- Use of pesticides at necessary levels
- Anti-resistance strategies
- Check and record success of plant protection measures
